Partner A and B are modeling lab procedures. Partner B notices that some students are not attending. Partner B uses non-verbal signaling to make Partner A aware of the students. Partner B then suggests to Partner A that they select a “few students” to hold the materials being demonstrated (beakers). Partner A implements the suggestion and calls those students to the front “to assist.”



ACTION: Monitor student behavior and implement engagement strategies.

The teaching partner who is monitoring students can often determine the need for modifications. Partners should maintain awareness of each other's actions and be open to each other's input.
